Women as easy targets

- Women in business
- Women in family partnerships
- Women in agriculture
- Socially vulnerable women
- Women caring for elderly relatives

Violation of human rights

- 1950 - European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR).
- 1979 – UN Convention regarding discrimination against women.
- Through their abuse of the legal system, corruption of the Rule of Law and range of other actions, Lloyds Banking Group and its professional agents have violated both.

Lloyds' modus operandi

- Abuse of the legal system including redaction, falsification and destruction of evidence; signature & document forgery; Land Registry fraud
- Wrongful bankruptcy
- Invalidly appointed LPA receivers
- Entrapment: using regulatory & trade bodies to discredit targeted customers.
- Fraudulent misrepresentation / perjury in court

Mental Health

- Financial anxiety & stress
- Depression & PTSD
- Psychological abuse
- Coercive control
- Mistreatment of whistleblowers
- Lloyds' sponsorship of mental health charities – deeply hypocritical

Consequences

- Divorce
- Loss of livelihood & pension provision
- Family breakup
- Inter-generational harm: impact on children
- Destitution
- Suicide
